Urban/Rural Rides completed its first official rides in the new expansion areas of Western Valley and the Northwest Region on February 15th. Volunteers and clients are excited to see the service operating in regions that struggle for transportation solutions. Urban/Rural Rides, using volunteer drivers, offers an affordable transportation option to assist people in accessing medical appointments and other essential life services.

What started as three small groups operating in Southeast NB, Rural Rides, Tele-Drive and the drive program of the Volunteer Centre of SENB have seen record growth since they decided to merge and work together as Urban/Rural Rides. The first phase of growth was to expand service to the entire Southeast NB area encompassing all of Albert and Westmorland Counties. In 2021, Greater Fredericton Social Innovation contacted Urban/Rural Rides to expand and offer service in the greater Fredericton area. Expansion continues there with five municipalities in the region currently receiving service.

In 2022, the Province of New Brunswick assigned transportation as a mandate of the regional service commissions. The Western Valley Regional Service Commission and the Northwest Regional Service Commission then began to look for ways to provide transportation in their regions. Watching the expansion into the

Fredericton region prompted both commissions to reach out to Urban/Rural Rides to expand and offer the same service in their regions as well.

The recruitment and preparation of volunteers began and both services officially launched in February 2023. Now, as the client base builds, recruitment will be ongoing to keep up with the demand.

The board and staff of Urban/Rural Rides are very excited to be able to assist those in need of transportation throughout all four regions. # Albert County Historical Society Hosts Presentation as part of Riverview Winter Carnival! by Dawne McLean & Janet Clouston

On Thursday, February 9th from 2-4 pm, the Albert County Historical Society (ACHS) was pleased to host a heritage presentation at the Town Hall in Riverview as part of the 2023 Winter Carnival programming. Through collaborations with the Riverview Parks and Recreation Department, the Albert County Museum had previously hosted senior tours and provided the AC175 Mobile Exhibit for display in the Town Hall lobby during the 2022 Heritage Week. However, the 2023 February heritage talk at the Town Hall was the first 'in-person' presentation by the ACHS scheduled by the Town of Riverview during a major event. The ACHS greatly appreciated this opportunity as it aligns with their mandate of Outreach and Education.

The 40 attendees were treated to an excellent Heritage Talk presented by Dawne McLean, ACHS President and published author of

"A Glimpse of Past Days". Dawne provided an overview of her family's multi-generational connection to the County and shared remarkable stories of "past days" by reading from her new book and displaying momentos and historical items. Along with Museum Manager, Janet Clouston, the two-hour program concluded with a vibrant Question & Answer session with discussions of WWI history, stories of shipbuilding, ship captains, and other unique and interesting aspects of rural life along the Fundy Coast.

Also included in the heritage event was the AC175 Mobile Exhibit (featured in photos). Created in 2020 with support by Tourism, Heritage and Culture NB, this four-sided interactive display features 36 unique stories of the history of Albert County and of "The Land, Sea and People" of the area. A timeline of significant events between 1845 and 2020 wraps around the bottom panels of the

#### **2023 RESOLUTIONS**

Our Annual General Meeting will take place in Moncton on Tuesday May 9th, 2023. The deadline to submit the 2023 annual Resolutions to the New Brunswick Senior Citizens Federation for presentation at the 2023 AGM is March 31st, 2023.

Guidelines for Presentation of Resolutions to the Federation:

- 1. It is by way of resolutions that Federation members bring their concerns to the AGM.
- 2. Resolutions may be submitted by any individual member, club or zone which is a member in good standing of the Federation.

- 3. All resolutions endorsed at the AGM and which require action by the Province of New Brunswick or the Government of Canada shall be submitted to the appropriate minister, department or agency for response.
- 4. It is therefore important that resolutions be carefully worded so that the Federation is directed to take the appropriate action and that the proper message is conveyed.
- 5. The Federation does not wish to receive resolutions which pit one member, club or zone against another.
- 6. Members, clubs and zones submitting resolutions regarding Community Safety and Crime Prevention matters are advised to focus on the "principle" of the issue being addressed and avoid attempts to reword the criminal code.
- 7. A national vocabulary should be used when drafting resolutions. Local references may detract from the national significance of resolutions.
- 8. The Federation does not wish to receive resolutions that contradict the Federation's Constitution and Bylaws.
- 9. The descriptive clauses (WHEREAS...) should clearly and briefly set out the reasons for the resolution. If the sponsor believes that the rationale cannot be explained in a few preliminary clauses, the problem should be more fully stated in supporting documentation.
- 10. Resolutions from the floor will be accepted at the AGM as long as they are presented when arriving at the AGM and that copies are available for all participants.
