It started a fun conversation between us about how she thinks I could make the banana bread without reading any instructions because I make it so often and it is so good. I don't know about that theory, but it got me thinking about my own childhood memories of baking with my own mother and grandmother. Truth be told the banana bread recipe I use was given to me by my mother.

I have many very fond memories of baking with my mom and my grandmother. My favorite recipe to make with my Grammy was her doughnuts recipe. I still try to make them a couple times a year but have yet to perfect them the way she did. Whenever I do make them it always brings a smile to my face to think of the way she would talk when we made them. "Oh just a pinch of this and a little of that" she would say. Banana Bread

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 2 eggs
- 1 cup sugar
- 4 Tbsp sour milk
- 1tsp soda
- · 2 cups flour
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 3-4 mushy bananas (darker the better)

Directions:

- Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C).
- · Beat eggs then add sugar.
- . Dissolve soda in milk then add to mixture
- · Add flour and salt to mixture.
- · Mash bananas with a fork and add last.
- · Pour the batter into the prepared loaf pan, until 34 full.
- Bake in the oven for 55-60 minutes. It is finished when a toothpick poked in center comes out clean. Add 5 minutes at a time until done.



Perfect Dessert for an Election Year: Tory Pudding with

Liberal Sauce by James Wilson

My Mom worked for a number of years as a cook at Camp Wildwood. While some of the things she made would end up on the dinner table for years after, none had quite so unique a name as Tory Pudding with Liberal Sauce. Since its an election year let's take a moment to look at this politically-named dessert.

The name contains a pun with 'liberal' both referring to the party and the generous portion of sugary sauce. Its a fun name for what is essentially a type of bread pudding but its not the only name. In Mom's old Barbour cookbook it is referred to as 'Radio Pudding', presumably because people got the recipe off the radio. Searching either name brings up many alternate names such as 'Halifax Pudding', 'Montreal Pudding', 'Half-hour Pudding', and even 'Unemployment Pudding'! Clearly this pudding has gotten around.

The *recipe itself* is simple. You will need;

1 cup of flour

½ cup of white sugar

1 tsp soda

2 tsp cream of tartar

¼ tsp salt

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of raisins (an unnecessary amendment, in my view, that you are free to vote down)

½ cup of milk

½ tsp vanilla



Sauce ingredients:

½ cup brown sugar

butter the size of a large walnut

2 cups of boiling water

Butter a casserole dish or 8x8 pan. Mix together the ingredients for the dough and put it in the pan.

In a bowl, mix the brown sugar, boiling water, and the butter until combined. Pour over the dough.

There is also an alternative method of putting the sauce in the pan first and dolloping the dough over it. Regardless of how you do it the tory pudding will end up rising above the liberal sauce as it bakes (this is not political commentary).

Place, uncovered, in a 350-degree oven for about 25-30 minutes or until it's reaches a nice brown colour and crusty appearance.

Perhaps members of the NDP are upset they are not included in this dessert. Never fear! A nickname for the party is the 'Dippers', which is another name for a ladle or scoop. This happens to be just the sort of tool you will need to serve this politically-themed dessert. So nice to see all parties working together so well.







A maximum of 64 cubic feet of waste will be accepted. Only 3 large clean-up items (fridge, stove, freezer, dishwasher, humidifier, washer, BBQ, couch, mattress, dresser, etc.). Large garbage items should be bagged, boxed or bundled into packages weighing not more than 45lbs or no longer than 6 feet. Please ensure all cardboard is broken down and tied. Tires (removed from rims) will be accepted at 4 per household.

NO CONSTRUCTION/DEMOLITION WASTE. NO CAR PARTS, NO WOOD ASHES.

Reminder: black bags will not be accepted

Regular weekly garbage will be collected the same day. Please separate your garbage properly and set it off to the side for that week.
